

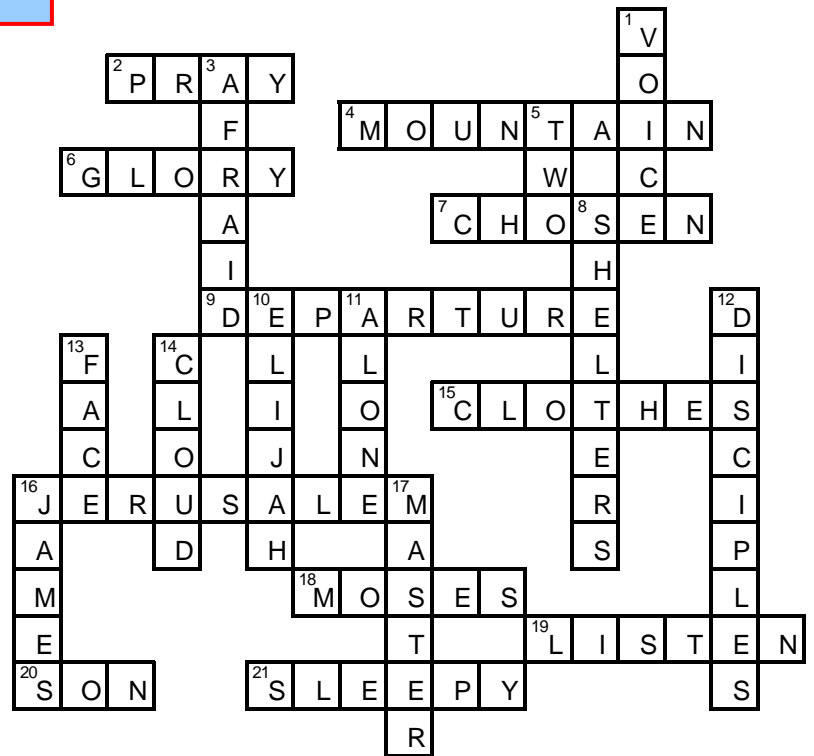
TIPS for parents and teachers

What do missionaries give up when they go to another country?

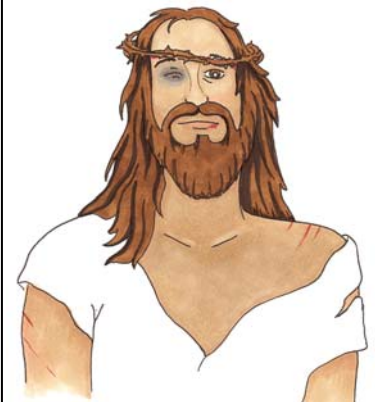
What do we give up when we follow Him, even right in our own homes and schools?



IT'S NOT FAIR!

Ask the kids to think of a time when they got in trouble for something that they didn't do. How did it feel? How did you feel toward the person that really should have been in trouble?

Jesus was in **BIG** trouble, and had never **sinned**. He endured being made fun of, beaten up, death, and perhaps worse of all, separation from His Father, because of **our** sin!
